Stafford Borough - Dementia Friendly 2020

Today 7% of people over the age of 65 are living with dementia – that's over 700,000 people in England, according to NHS England - with the number set to double in the next 30 years, as the population ages.

So it is important to raise the awareness of the disease so that we can support people to live well with dementia, in their own homes and communities, helping to maintain a stable environment for as long as possible.

There is a vision for the wider Stafford area to be dementia friendly by 2020 with many organisations coming on board including:-

Was formally opened by reigning Olympic Gold Medal canoeist Joe Clarke MBE, supported by The High Sheriff for Staffordshire, Pippa Gee and the Mayor and Lady Mayoress of Stafford Borough, Councillors Ray and Jenny Barron in June 2018.

The project led by Chebsey Parish Council and Friends of Norton Bridge, on what was once a Stafford Borough Council play area, raised in excess of £50,000 in a little over two years, proving what can be achieved when a community comes together with a common objective.



Bus Services – Need Passengers to Keep Running



Bus Services are a vital community link, particularly in rural areas and as people get older. However to survive they need passengers to remain viable. This is certainly true about the Number 72 and 72a Bus linking Ferndown Drive to Newcastle via Clayton Village.

Never has the well-worn phrase '**Use it – or lose it**' been so apt. There are two things that local residents in that area can do to keep their treasured bus service –

- Firstly use the bus as much as possible, it will reduce congestion and pollution, whilst being highly punctual and reliable and keep it on the road
- Secondly and this does not affect people's rights to use their bus passes but if people with concessionary travel can afford to pay for their journeys, then doing so by not showing their bus pass may just keep the bus financially viable for the operator and on the road.

Tough times call for us all to work together.

With the announcement in March 2018 of the possible closure of Gist's operating base at Raleigh Hall Industrial Estate in Eccleshall and the threat to the 160 jobs onsite, a rapid reaction taskforce – including Stafford Borough Council, Staffordshire County Council and the Department for Work and Pensions - was created and parachuted onto site.

Thanks to this fast reaction, the transfer of staff to other Gist sites and the employment of others at local logistics companies, the net impact was that 37 employees were made redundant, with the majority of those coming from further afield – minimising the impact on the local economy.

Thanks to an agreement with Matthew Ellis, the Police and Crime Commissioner for Staffordshire, to use the Eccleshall Police Station car park, thirteen authorised traders have been able to park their cars off the main thoroughfares in Eccleshall, to leave even more space for their customers to come and frequent all of the delights that Eccleshall has to offer - from award winning Master Butchers, Bakers, Florists and clothes shops through to quality eateries and hostelries.

Bethan Ward's (of Eccleshall) input and drive was invaluable in getting the scheme running.

However, despite the signage being clear that this is a private car park for authorised users only, a number of people continue to abuse the scheme, which is threatening its continuation – the same old story 'the mindless actions of a few could cause problems to the majority'

The scheme cost £500 to implement and was up and running within 5 weeks of the agreement.

It's objective is to allow Stafford based people to raise money, to support local people with 100% of the money raised staying locally, not consumed in

administration or running costs.

Equally because only the interest from the moneys raised is used to support the local third sector, it will be sustainable and supporting good causes in fifty or a hundred years time.

The fund launched with £45,000 and has a target of £1m over the next three to five years.

Funding of Supported Accommodation – some progress at last

For anyone who has followed all 8 Newsletters, they will know that I have long campaigned for a couple of positive changes to the funding by central government of supported housing – this affects not only people in short term accommodation like homeless hostels, shelters and refuges but also in long term housing like sheltered and supported housing schemes.

In early August came the news from government that this lobbying in part had been successful and government would row-back from proposals to remove the funding source from Housing Authorities.

This is the most positive news in this area in a long time, with further consultation to happen on the funding of support also announced. So more work to be done but progress nonetheless.
