Stafford — a Dementia Friendly Community

The Power of Partnership

The media have been raising the awareness of mental health and also dementia consistently over the past twelve months and rightly so—to help reduce the stigma of these health based illnesses, given there seemed to be a disconnect between physical illnesses and mental ones.

In Stafford, Choices Housing, working out of the Dementia Extra Care facility at Limewood, which is part of the brand new—and award winning—Northfield Village, have been working to get Stafford to be a dementia friendly community by 2020.

Such has been the success of their work that in September 2018—a full fifteen months early—Stafford has been accredited by the Alzheimer's Society as being a Dementia Friendly Community.



Stafford recognised as Dementia Friendly

More than 2,500 new Dementia Friends have been created in 2018, with many new organisations committed to supporting those with the disease. But more can be done, as this disease is set to affect 1.5m people by 2050, as the population ages.

So the next step of the plan for Stafford borough's area is to set up a volunteer network to help carers to be able to maintain as normal a life as possible.

Destination Eccleshall Launches

As our High Streets fight to maintain shoppers and sales one of the things that can be done is to promote not just the individual businesses but also 'the destination' for the strength of everything the area has to offer.

With 40% of shops nationwide predicted to close over the next ten years, areas like Eccleshall need to be ahead of everyone else if they are to buck the trend. And once retail has deserted the High Street, the risk is that it is only residential conversion that's left.

Judges Award—Eccleshall Great War Project



Eccleshall's Historical Society was awarded 'The Judges Award' at this year's Stafford Borough Council Community

In 2013 Eccleshall Historical Society chose to commemorate the Great War by researching the history of the forty five men and one woman who appear on the Holy Trinity War Memorial.

During this research they found several names that had connections to Eccleshall but didn't appear on the memorial. So the group decided to get these names added onto the memorial and launched a community dialogue, including a funding campaign to do so.

In 2018 the names of the men with connections to Eccleshall were added onto the memorial, along with a refurbishment of the memorial itself, with a re-dedication happening in the Summer of 2018—a fitting commemoration of those brave men.

Potholes — please report them

The best way of getting a pot hole fixed is to report it online or via telephone—it will be assessed and then prioritised

I have reported plenty of pot holes over the last eighteen months and some of the worst ones were on the minor road network.

The ones linking Whitgreave and in Little Sugnall were some of the worst, as was the A519 at Cotes Heath.

Despite continual discussion on how best to get potholes fixed,

the message is not fully understood - that pot holes won't be looked at if the County Council is not aware of them.

Today there are not the reactive crews to go and survey each and every road in the County (- all 3,950 miles of them, 86% being minor roads). Instead country lanes are only surveyed annually, so unreported problems could go a maximum of a year without being picked up.

Double Quick Speed Signs for Great Bridgeford

Speeding vehicles have been a problem in Great Bridgeford for many years, with various initiatives used to try and curb their impact, including a longstanding Community Speedwatch group.

On 9th March 2018, members of Seighford Parish Council met out on site with a view of trying a new approach—that of using modern vehicle activated speed signs at three locations in the village.

Following some funding from

both the Safer Roads Partnership and some Eccleshall County Councillor Divisional Highways moneys, the Parish Council were able to pull together a scheme.

This scheme was launched on 29th September 2018 and demonstrates what can be achieved with focus, despite needing to source the funding, supplier of the signs and having them safely installed.

Well done to the Parish Councillors involved.

New Housing Being Delivered in Blythe Bridge

Stafford and Rural Homes—the largest social housing landlord in Stafford Borough, with some 6,500 homes—had long wanted to transform the former Blythe Lodge site, which had been for older persons accommodation. It had become tired and was not modern fit for purpose housing.

So supported by £390k of funding from Homes England - the Homes & Communities Agency - Stafford and Rural Homes and construction partner Harpers have been

working to transform the site, with the development of thirteen new affordable homes for rent at Spring Lodge Avenue which will include a mix of one and two bed apartments and two and three bed houses. These will be available in the Spring 2019.

Bringing forward these schemes to ensure that there is an appropriate mix of housing of all types and tenures, right the way across the Borough, is an important way of ensuring that Stafford has sufficient housing to meet the needs of all local people.

Tips on bus services :-

- They need to be commercially viable to stay running—so use them or face losing them
- If you don't need to show your concessionary card, and instead can afford to pay, please don't show the card, it can affect the viability of the whole route

D & G Buses Support an Alternative Way of Working

When Norton Bridge station ceased to be a stopping point for trains, a rail replacement bus service was put on.

That service—the 13 and 13a—has cost £100,000 a year of central government funding to run but is due to terminate at the end of March 2019.

One of the services potentially affected is the 07:50hrs Eccleshall to Stafford commuter service, if proposals are implemented as planned.

Having met with the Managing Director of D & G Buses we have looked at ways of maintaining at least the busy commuter service at 07:50hrs, even if other less

popular services are terminated.

It will take some additional funding from a variety of partners, but at this stage it is believed that a suitable plan can be delivered to maintain the 07:50hrs Eccleshall to Stafford service, when the existing service terminates in March 2019, if nothing more.

Housing Minister Announces Domestic Violence Funding at Stafford Refuge

Staffordshire Women's Aid has secured an additional £103,000 of funding, towards mental health support services for women affected by domestic violence. The national announcement of an additional £22m of funding towards domestic violence was made from the Stafford refuge during a visit there.

After 15 months of planning the Isabel Trail parkrun launched in December. It is a free to attend run over the same timed 5Km course every Saturday starting at 9am—from the other side of J Sainsbury Stafford car park.

It is run along the scenic but flat Isabel Trail—good for those new into running as well as those looking for a personal best. It has been funded by the Borough Council, Freedom Leisure and my County Councillor Community Grant. parkruns:

- encourage new people into exercise and actively keep people engaged about 60% of attendees would not have done any exercise otherwise
- are volunteer and community based, so become self-sufficient very quickly

Whilst this benefits those local charities, Halfords guarantee the women on attaining a certain level of competence a job on release in one of the 465 Halfords stores across the country.
